tion of scholars," she said. Moey said the invitation to attend the reunion was for all BBGSians who have benefitted from the excellent education they received from BBGS and whose lives have been touched in some way.

She encouraged all to remember the fun fairs, food sales and collections for the less fortunate carried out in the

past.
"I think nothing would give greater joy to Miss Cooke and all our former principals than to know that BBGSians are continuing to live out the values we learnt in BBGS. This was the legacy they left for us. "BBGS girls all over the

world, not just in Malaysia, please take heed of this message and send us your contributions if you cannot come back to join us in this celebration of a 121-year of education legacy, she said.

Cooke was the first Malaysian principal of BBGS and served from 1958 to 1977. She was also a student, teacher and later BBGS board of governors chairman. BBGS became a premier school in Malaysia through several initiatives carried out by Cooke.

BBGS, which was located on Jalan Bukit Bintang, became one of the country's first smart schools. The buildings were later demolished and the school, which is no longer known by its original name,

was relocated to the Smart School Complex in Taman Shamelin Perkasa in Cheras. The complex now houses SK Seri Bintang Utara, SK Seri Bintang Selatan, SMK Seri Bintang Utara and SMK Seri Bintang Selatan.
